Everything went as planned with times of everything. The food was an awesome idea. Food was left over and we donated all leftovers and water to the open door. I enjoyed handing the chips out for everyone. This gave me a chance to meet everyone that was in the room. I saw people that was coming back from a terrible relapse and was there to be a part of.

I want to thank Peggy and Don for chairing the Marathon meeting. From the sounds of Peggy, they had strugglers came in through the whole event and touched a few people. Thanks, we appreciate your service in helping with the event. I am glad Don came out and got something to eat. My soul is full today of love, happiness and freedom from addiction. Last night was full of it and grateful that Amanda M, Will V, and I had a hand in putting this Newcomer Event on.

114 people that we have tickets for, some people walked in without checking in. 48 of that 107 were people with under 6 months clean. The most clean time recorded were 3 people had 35yrs and one person with 34yrs. The least clean time was 2 days clean. This person was not even with the treatment centers. The treatment centers that were there was DOT, Ten 16, Saginaw psychological, sober living and Emmaus house. A group from the open door were also there. 48 of that count had under 6 months clean. After 4 o'clock we did not have anyone at the tables as you walked in so none of them got counted.

Out of fifteen hundred which was our budget we are giving back monies. Who would have thought that area gets money back. We can always save it for next year's Event Hint! Hint!
