Hi Fellows,

We have a lot of good stuff happening in PR currently! We have a couple new positions filled in the past couple months, we welcomed Michelle A as Fellowship Development, Gil U. as Secretary and Sally S. as Phone Line Coordinator! We have a great team this year, working hard to find new ways to reach the still sick and suffering addict. We still have the positions of Meeting List Coordinator and Co-Secretary open, which are both great first experiences to get your feet wet in PR. Co-Secretary has a minimum clean time requirement of 3 months, Meeting List Coordinator has a clean time of at least 6 months. Come get involved in PR and help us carry the message that's there's a better way to live! As reported last month we have our updated PR guidelines today to bring to the area for approval, I have printed copies to distribute so we can review them in new business today. We are working on getting the ER packets and Law enforcement packets ready so we can pass those out in the community. For these we have a budget request of \$101.20 for the purchase literature. A total of 400 IP's (100 Welcome to NA, 100 Intro to NA meetings, 100 Am I an Addict? And 100 For the Newcomer). This will give us a total of 20 facility envelopes with 5 smaller envelopes inside that can be given directly to addicts that will include these 4 IP's, a phone numbers list, a meeting schedule and a letter to the addict. We have also brought back the practice of clearing fellows as H&I trusted servants to take meetings into facilities as a committee immediately prior to the start of the PR Subcommittee meeting. If you know anyone interested in being cleared through PR to take these meetings into a facility please send them to the PR Subcommittee meeting in January! We are in need of women to help take meetings into Phoenix, spread the word! We are also working on scheduling our first H&I Workshop/Training event of the year that will be happening after the New Year. We will be looking for fellows who have or are currently doing this type of service to participate and possibly speak at the event. Let me know if you're interested!
