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### **Q&A** Corner

Topic: Women in Recovery Questions – Jamie L. Answers – Kiersten J.

**Q:** Do you feel that women face different barriers than men in getting help with addiction? If so, what are they?

**A:** I really don't feel there are any gender-based barriers to getting help.

**Q:** Are there any particular challenges that women in recovery have to deal with that don't impact men?

**A:** I can't speak on whether or not men face similar issues, because I have no experience with that. However, one challenge can be finding other recovering women. Women do recover, but there are less of us.

**Q:** Is there anyways that you feel women recover differently than men?

**A:** I feel that each of us have parallel paths through recovery, male or female. Each individual's recovery is unique. Women may have different issues to inventory, but the solution is always the same.

**Q:** Have you ever attended any women's meeting and what ways were they beneficial to your recovery?

**A:** I have not attended a women's meeting, but I have sat at women's tables. They helped me to build trust in other women something I didn't have a lot of when I got here.

**Q:** Do you have any recommendations for women in recovery? **A:** I know for me, I constantly worried about being judged. I had to give myself a break and have faith that the people around me really wanted the best for me - especially women. I also built strong friendships with men I trusted in the program. I believe it is beneficial to have as many perspectives as possible. Find people you trust and hang on to them.



When I entered recovery, I slowly started to get back into these activities, but I lacked the self-confidence to follow through. I got clean on the third edition revised basic text. The very last story in book II was "Up From Down Under" a powerful story of recovery in NA as an atheist. When I got clean I was a card-carrying atheist and this story helped me stay in the program.

Back then we used to close our meetings with the Lord's Prayer, which gave me a hard time. Lucky for me, "we" as a fellowship stopped that and switched to the serenity prayer. It was around this time I began to use the gratitude slogan or the third step prayer to open or close meetings. Later I gave up being an atheist on my own and for my own reasons and beliefs. It was this story that gave me the courage to stay in NA when so many in it were trying to convert me to their own belief system.

A great, big thanks to my sponsor for pointing this story out to me. I found it funny that NA placed this story in the very back of the basic texts book II. Almost like putting it in the book at all was an afterthought? Either way it made it in, at some point in my recovery I saw the work of a higher power placing that story in the book at all and for having my sponsor point it out to me. There is a higher power, there is a plan, I don't get to know the plan, it's my choices (free will) that determines my serenity.
